Summary of the scenes:

Scene 1 (pp. 50–51): This scene shows New York City on New Year's Eve with its skyscrapers and busy streets. The streets seem to be crowded with people.

Scene 2 (pp. 52–53; parts of p. 54): This scene shows where and how the kids live. They live on the streets and they steal things (e.g. bags) to survive.

Scene 3 (parts of p. 54; p. 55): In this scene, the reader learns that the kids have to eat food from the dumpsters. They have names like Maybe, Rainbow and Tears.

Scene 4 (p. 56): In this scene, the kids are drawing graffiti on a wall in the dark. The kids in this scene also have strange names like Maggot or Jewel.

Scene 5 (p. 56, last panel; parts of p. 57): There are six kids who are sitting somewhere outside. They're having their dinner from the dumpsters.

Scene 6 (parts of p. 57 and p. 58): The kids are running away from the police. If the police catch them, they'll be brought to a juvenile home.

Task 3

: In the center of the picture, there are many skyscrapers and in the background, you can see the sky full of clouds. The Statue of Liberty is in the front of the picture. Task 4b

(Your solution doesn't have to be that detailed)

p. 54: several small panels: The sizes and shapes of the panels create a quiet atmosphere and make the reader live through the story. The stylistic elements match the content because the sequence of the panels is clearly structured.

p. 58: overlapping panels: The sizes and shapes of the overlapping panels show the reactions and feelings of the characters. The stylistic elements match the content because they create fast action and speed.

Task 5

(Your solution doesn't have to be that detailed)

The artist chose the colors black and white for her graphic novel. These colors match the story very well because the sad colors reflect the sad and dangerous situation for the homeless teenagers in New York. They don't seem to have a bright future, and because the police chase them, their future seems to be very dark. That's why the artist chose dark colors.
