

## Lösungen zu den Aufgaben im Buch

p. 53, ex. 2:

Viele denkbare Varianten und Uhrzeiten sind möglich. Achten Sie beim Korrigieren bitte auf Folgendes:

- Das Häufigkeitsadverb steht vor dem eigentlichen Verb: I sometimes play computer games in the evenings.
- Jeder Satz endet mit einem Punkt.

p. 53, ex. 3:

a) In einem Satz ohne eine Form von *to be* steht das Häufigkeitsadverb vor dem Verb. In einem Satz mit einer Form von *to be* steht das Häufigkeitsadverb nach der Form von *to be*.

b) Zeitangaben stehen entweder am Satzanfang oder am Satzende, nie zwischendrin.

p. 53, ex. 4:

1. I sometimes go to bed late. 2. In the evenings I'm usually at home. 3. I often read animal books. 4. I never watch TV in the mornings. 5. I'm always happy on Sundays. 6. On Saturdays I often play tennis. 7. I'm never late for school. 8. I always have breakfast at 7 o'clock. 9. After school I usually play with my little brother.

p. 53, ex. 5:

They often go to the workshops at stay4ever and we always love them. It is never easy to get up on a Saturday at 7 o'clock. But we usually forget that when we are there. On Saturday mornings we often do Jazz-dance, in the afternoons we usually dance Hip-Hop. In the evenings we sometimes go to a Musical. We often do a group dance on Sundays. In the evening we are so tired – but happy. Thank you stay4ever!

p. 54, ex. 6:

1. We always get up at 6.45. 2. And my roommates Tyler and Steve always snore. 3. But I sometimes snore too, so it's okay. 4. There are always lots of students in the cafeteria before lessons. 5. It's never boring for me here with all the new people. 6. In the morning we usually practise a favourite song alone. 7. After lunch we never sing alone. 8. After singing, it's usually time for dancing with other coaches. 9. At 6:00 (p.m.) we have dinner. 10. We often talk about our

new dance moves. 11. On the last evening of the workshop there's always a show and we sing our favourite songs.

p. 56, ex. 13:

1. Sid the cat lives with Dave and his parents. 2. Every day Sid explores the Kidbrooke Garden. 3. He goes to other streets in Greenwich too. 4. But he always comes home again. 5. Mrs Preston looks after the neighbours' pets. 6. She does her work in a surgery. 7. She works on Saturdays too. 8. Holly sometimes brings her guinea pigs to the surgery. 9. In the evenings Mr Preston often watch **(Vorsicht Aussprache: watch-iz)** TV in the living room. 10. But he sometimes sleeps on the sofa. 11. Then Dave says **(-s nach Vokal+y = -vs)**, "Dad, go to bed!" 12. Dave never tidies **(-s nach Konsonant+y = -ies)** his room. 13. But he likes cooking.

p. 57, ex. 14:

Holly: My sister Amber loves black. Her crazy friends often come to our flat. They listen to awful music.

Jay: My mother asks a lot of questions about my homework. My parents always talk about school. It gets on my nerves!
