b) Lösungsvorschlag:

Hi everybody,

Last night, I was talking to some English teenagers about au-pair exchanges. When I said that today even males can get jobs as au-pairs, they didn't believe me. So I had a look on the internet and guess what? Yeah, I found a testimonial by a German guy called Timo. Timo worked as an au-pair for a family in New Zealand and his main job was to look after the four-year-old son. They spent a lot of time in parks, visited friends, and did all the usual kinds of activities that children enjoy. He also taught the boy how to write and how to play the piano. They had a great time together and the little boy became like a brother for him. Timo says he was expected to do some household chores as well, such as cleaning and looking after the pets, but that wasn't a problem for him.

Overall, he says he enjoyed the experience very much and he doesn't see any reason why people shouldn't go to New Zealand as au-pairs.

- a) 1. The general problem is that even though Ivory Coast seems to make a lot of money with cocoa exports, 40% of its population live below the poverty line. Child labour on the cocoa plantations is a big issue there. Some farmers claim they have to employ children because they don't earn much money themselves and can't afford to pay adult workers.
 - 2. The statistics are important because they show the cocoa controversy: Ivory Coast should be a rich country because the chocolate industry is worth £60 billion a year and Ivory Coast provides 35% of the world's cocoa. However, 40% of the population live below the poverty line and child labour is a big problem there. In fact, in Ivory Coast about 100,000 children are working on the cocoa plantations. Some farmers claim that they themselves earn less than £2 a day.
- b) **Main message:** The main message of the report is that we should buy fair trade products in order to end child labour.

Jobs: carry heavy tools and equipment; chop down cocoa pods with machetes; cut the pods open with machetes to get the cocoa beans; carry heavy containers full of cocoa beans and dump the beans onto a truck
